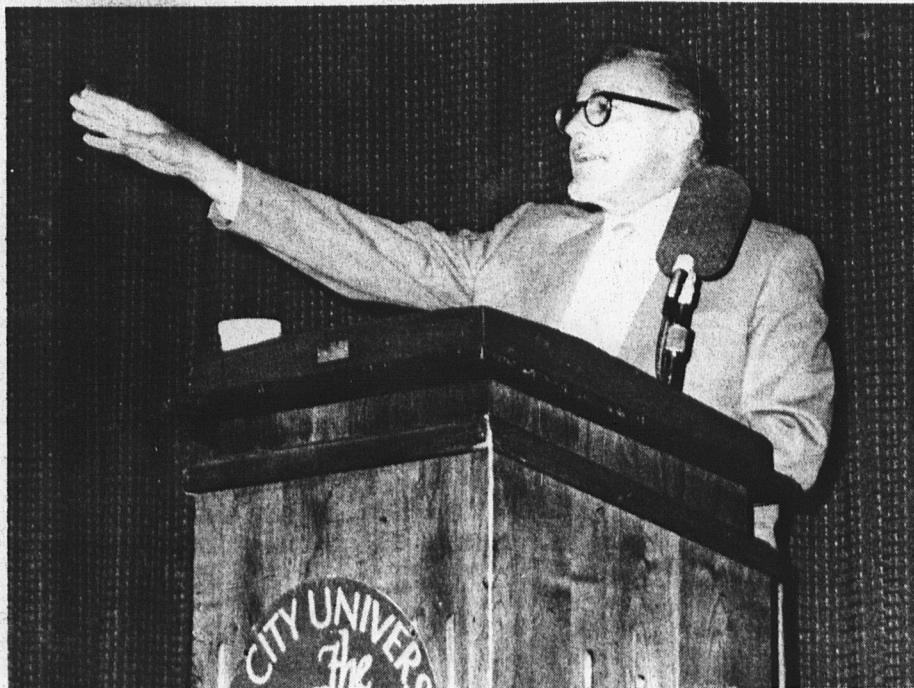
He continued, "The proposed financial aid cuts will irreparably damage the educational careers of many who attend America's colleges."
