Third World Plans Strategy

On Thursday, September 25. SALT OF THE EARTH, the Discussion Club and the Black Panther Party continued their academic and residential community convening the THIRD WORLD CONFERENCE. The Conference also sought to start a RAINBOW COALITION, that is the unification of all races under one organization, for the purpose of initiating some meaningful action in helping all the residents of Staten Island and offering the program to transient students for them to carry the idea back to their various communities throughout the city.

The meeting began with an informative report from a white student living in Bedford-Stuyvesant and his involvement in starting a day care center and gas station in that community. The day care center was started one year and half ago by five young men with financial help from private sources. The service is now the largest in New York State, that's including State operated day care centers! The group is now attempting to establish a gas station in the area with all profits going to the day care center.

This enterprise illustrates the true path an organization should take in serving the people. As was pointed out at the meeting, schools are open from 9-3 but parents work from 9-6. How are parents supposed to care for their children during the time they have to go and return from work? Banks and the Motor Vehicle Bureau are in the same situation. The state does not consider the problems of the working class in this country but rather devises ingenious ways to complicate their lives. The concept utilized by this student and his associates impressed the conference and we embarked on an investigation of various areas we could proceed in.

A suggestion was made that we institute some type or social service program on Staten Island but use the money to further the center in Brooklyn. Another idea was presented to the group that we begin to examine how to set up a book store or lunch area owned and operated by the Coalition with all profits going directly to improving facilities and community services of this com-

Before we begin to undertake any project, we must relate to the community and prove our sincerity and our legitimacy. A plan was offered whereby we would circulate a petition against

the exploitative nature of the toll on the Verrazano Bridge. Since students and residents must commute over the bridge twice a day for an exorborant fee of \$1.00, we thought that attacking this continuous expense from our pockets could open up areas that the group needed initially. The circulation of the petition would allow us to meet and talk with various segments of the community and begin to outline the goals of the RAINBOW COALITION.

This would not be a step of deception, where we would use the community for our own publicity nor would it be used as a vanguard issue of the politics of the Coalition but rather, an attempt to help the community and establish the foundation for an effective campaign of serving and educating the people. All of the above suggestions will be discussed and analyzed at our upcoming meetings.

In order for this alliance to succeed, we need the support and inventive ideas from at least this community. I urge all Black, Brown, Oriental and White members of this community (that includes everybody from the President of the College to the maintenance workers) to watch for further meetings and bring your suggestions that will help mold our policy. The Rainbow Coalition is an important step for us since it means applying the theories we have been studying for years and showing something for all the rhetoric we've been using.

Birenbaum Makes New Appointments

Released from President's office

Changes in the administrative structure at Staten Island Community College and additions to the staff to meet the needs of the college's new programs, were announced on September 17 by Dr. William M. Birenbaum, president of the college.

Heading the list of changes is the designation of Dean James L.G. Fitz Patrick, who had been Dean of the Academic Program, as Dean of Faculty. In the new title, Dean Fitz Patrick will be responsible for all curricular programming at Staten Island Com-

munity College, including the day, evening and summer sessions, as well as non-credit courses and programs.

Dean Fitz Patrick, a resident of Staten Island for nearly 40 years, was one of the first faculty members appointed at the college after it was founded in 1956. In announcing his new designation, President Birenbaum said: "Dean Fitz Patrick in many ways represents all that is most impressive about both the college and the community-at-large. He continues to be an inspiration to me and to his other colleagues as

Working directly under Dean Fitz Patrick will be the newlydesignated Associate Dean of Faculty, Martin Kuhn. Also on Dean Fitz Patrick's staff will be Assistant Dean Peter Nigro, also a Staten Island resident, who will be responsible for coordination of the evening, summer and adult education programs. Assistant Professor Michael Petrides, also a Staten Islander, will move up to become Director of the Evening and Summer Programs.

A new comer to Staten Island Community College will take over a newly established position as Director of Permanent Education, charged with developing new programs in continuing education for adults. The new post will be filled by L. Steven Zwerling, who is coming to SICC from Queens College, where he was Director of Faculty and Curriculum for the SEEK Program after having served as an instructor in the English department.

Another new post, Associate Dean of Students, is going to Joseph R. Harris, another newcomer to SICC, who is shifting from York College in Queens, where he was in charge of all community-related programs. He previously had been with the New York City Human Resources Administration, the National Conference of Christians and Jews, and the Peace Corps.

Also assigned to the office of the Dean of Students, as Director of the college's financial aids programs, is Assistant Professor Harold W. Stamps, who has moved to Staten Island from North Carolina, where he was an instructor at Palmer Memorial Institute and, prior to that, an assistant dean at Hampton Institue, his alma mater.

To handle the programs carried on directly from President Birenbaum's office, James P. Wooten has been named Director of Community Relations. Mr. Wooten has been filling the post of Director of Institutional Research and heading the Community Scholar Program. In his community relations title he will be the coordinator for that program as well as other special programs.

In the area of the college's business operations, Alexander Clark, who was with the city's Department of Personnel, has joined the SICC staff as deputy to the fiscal officer and personnel officer for non-instructional

"These changes," Dr. Birenbaum said in announcing the new structures, "will enable Staten Island Community College to more efficiently handle the programs it has undertaken in the last year, and to venture into new areas of educational service to the community. We feel that much has been accomplished in opening higher education to all sectors of the Staten Island community, but there is much more yet to be done."

Apathy Reigns Supreme

The new school year was started with the same enthusiasm and cooperation as was shown last semester when the school year ended. During club hours on Thursday September 18th, when President Birenbaum held his first open forum of the new semester, he was delighted to open his speech to an interested audience of fifteen students, members of the faculty and administration. After a quick five minute recitation he left the podium and had a casual talk with the few representatives of the student body that were present.

At the suggestion of Mr. Steven Zwerling, a member of the administrative staff, the President promised to return in ten minutes so that, in the meantime, a decent representation of the student body could be found. By abducting people from meetings, social gatherings in the hallways and luncheon in the cafeteria, a presentable audience appeared in the lounge when the meeting convened. Much to their surprise the audience found out that the President was actually talking and answering questions about subjects which concerned them as

There is no longer a question of

whether or not there is student apathy in this school because it has been proven that it does exist by many instances just like this.

What does the President have to say about this? To paraphrase from his speech: "In all the other colleges and City Universities in 1969, the Presidents are worrying about student disruptions on campus. Here in this college this is not one of my problems. I am more worried about colleges where the students will let the president do pretty much as he damn well pleases."

On October 24th elections for the offices of student government are being held at SICC as was pointed out by the President many times during the forum, the student government is one of the most important means the student has of presenting his ideas to the President and other members of his administration.

If you care about overcrowded classrooms, additional parking spaces, the high prices at the bookstore or any other thing that "bugs" you about this school, vote in the elections in October and be there to present your questions at the next open forum. If not, don't complain next semester when there are 47 people in you Math 16 class.


"Last Legs" Lounge On

Bronx Community Struggles for New Campus

CUNY Release Sept. 4

The City University yesterday split the construction contract for its Bronx Community College campus in an unprecedented move to generate competition among building industry contractors.

In July, City University rejected bids for all trades totalling \$103,000,000, almost double the \$53,000,000 estimated.

In the City Record yesterday (September 3), the City University advertised for bids on the first of four sections into which the air-space campus now has been divided. The foundation and street-level deck above the IND subway storage yards at Bedford Park Boulevard, designated as section A, is the first phase of a four-unit construction project. Bids on Section A due October 8 will include general construction, plumbing, and electrical work.

The remaining three sections, B, C, and D, are composed of the campus buildings and a plaza linking them. These sections will be bid as separate projects but erected simultaneously.

As the City Record appeared, Dr. Seymour C. Hyman, City University vice chancellor for campus planning and development summoned the building industry to become a partner with education in urban rebirth.

'City University in partnership with the building industry is creating 12 acres of new ground in the Bronx for a six-building campus where 4,500 day session students will go to class and thousands of Bronx residents will enjoy concerts, plays, lectures, and art exhibits," Dr. Hyman said yesterday. "It is a classic example of good urban planning.

"No residents are being moved. No property is coming off the tax rolls. We have the advantage of location adjacent to Lehman College and near several high schools. Public transportation is excellent,"

"Now all we need," Dr. Hyman continued, "is for the building industry to come forward and perform this job for us within a reasonable time limit and at reasonable cost. Sure it is a challenge, but Park Avenue was

erected over New York Central tracks at the turn of the century and we have just seen a Madison Square Garden and a huge office building erected over Penn Station while rail traffic continued."

Dr. Hyman explained that the foundation and street-level deck are to be completed in 18 months, providing a platform on which the construction of six buildings can proceed without interference from the track below.

"We expect that the campus can be occupied two years after the platform is completed," Dr. Hyman said.

A landscaped plaza 19, feet above the street level, will connect the first floors of the buildings and make the campus appear to float like a mythical city in Arabian Nights. The plaza includes a bridge over Bedford Park Boulevard.

Between the street-level platform and the plaza deck will be service areas and parking for 360 cars.

Just north of Bedford Boule-

vard, Section B, the five-story engineering, science, and administration building, will span the plaza deck, providing the entrance to the north campus. It has a skylighted interior court or atrium. The campus mall extends through the building to Section C, an open court surrounded by three additional academic structures: the library, the classroom building, and the music, drama, and arts building.

South of Bedford Park Boulevard is Section D made up of two buildings. A circular structure houses dining hall and student center. The health and physical education building spans the site at the extreme southern

The open landscaped plaza over Bedford Park Boulevard serves as a main approach from the Jerome Avenue Elevated and from Paul Avenue.

The architects are de Young and Moscowitz and Harry M. Prince and Associates. Structural engineers are Di Stasio and Van Buren. Mechanical engineers are Joseph R. Loring and Associates.

The subway storage yard is 20 feet below the street level. The street-level deck will rest on 800 columns rising between the tracks on footings or piles going to rock from six to 20 feet below the surface. A series of structural steel transfer girders will carry the load of the buildings to the 800 foundation columns.

The Transit Authority has agreed to provide four storage tracks at a time during construction, Dr. Hyman said, with additional tracks being made available at stated times. The yards are used for working trains and are consequently empty at rush hours.

The problem of vibration from the operating trains at the track level is being eliminated by the use of special lead pads under beams at street level. The noise generated from nearby elevated IRT trains and yard trains is reduced to a minimum by special double-glazed hermetically-sealed acoustic windows.

Batman Triumphs As Well As **CUNY's Summer Program**

It's another confrontation at City University of New York's City College. This time, between Superman and Batman, each age ten, both enrolled in the summer program for neighborhood youngsters that includes this drama class.

Batman, the smaller, but more aggressive, is setting a date for the life and death struggle between the two titans. "Meet me at 10 o'clock at the bridge."

"Alright," replies the somewhat reticent and chubby Super-

"You meet me at the bridge, and I'll knock you right off the bridge," threatens Batman.

At this point the tutor, a second-year student from Union Theological Seminary, removes the tape recorder microphone from between the boys and, taking a Gabe Pressman stance with voice to match, asks 'How come you have to fight it out? Isn't the ctiy big enough for you?"

"He thinks he's big and bad," Batman drawls as he casts a menacing look at Superman.

Following the tutor's instructions to fake a fight before the microphone, the boys "Wham!" "Biff!" "Pow!" and "Bam!" it out as their onlooking classmates make a thundering sound with their feet.

Finally, Superman slips limply to the floor. Batman has won. Thundering applause as the class eagerly awaits the playback from the tape recorder.

David Doely, the theological student and summertime drama instructor, explains that the confrontation is an exercise in improvisation, to give the children more self-confidence by teaching them to project their voices and then hear themsives on playback.

Another group of equally enthusiastic youngsters, at CUNY's John Jay College of Criminal Justice, are clustered around a strikingly handsome television actress who is planning trips with them to the Lincoln Center Library and to meet the cast and see a performance of "Hello Dolly" on Broadway.

The actress, a well-known video face, tells the visitor, politely but firmly, that she doesn't want her contribution to the CUNY program publicized. She explains her satisfaction is the response of the children, most from sorely disadvantaged neighborhoods, to a New York City experience they would otherwise have been de-

The programs at John Jay and City colleges are similar to CUNY summer activities on campuses throughout the five boroughs. Originally planned for youngsters of junior high age, some elementary school pupils are also enrolled.

There are about 1,000 children in the entire university-sponsored summer program. On each campus the routine differs, but all provide remedial, tutorial and counseling services as well as cultural and recreational activities every day.

This is the second year of the CUNY summer program. John Jay runs its program cooperatively with the nearby Bernard .M. Baruch College. In Queens, a joint effort by CUNY's York and Queensborough Community colleges is reaching youngsters from poverty areas of Jamaica. On Staten Island, the university's Richmond and Staten Island Community colleges are cooperating with private institutions -Wagner and Notre Dame colleges -to reach children throughout that borough.

"I'm just as appalled at it as some of the students are. Right now there's ALOT of room for improvement. Since it is under the jurisdiction of another group, there's not much I can do about

The House Committee which has been in existence since July 1, consists of four members of the student body with Dean Hirsch as their advisor. The committee is in the process of tackling the problem of finding money to refurnish the lounge.

"Unfortunately the committee can't bear the brunt of the whole thing." Dean Spiridon continued. "the week before this semester started, all the broken furniture was removed from the lounge. Can you imagine the impression a visitor to this college might get if he saw it? If a student was sitting in the lounge near an ashtray, there'd still be a tendency for ashes going on the floor. I feel this is a problem to be solved by the student body." He went on to say that it would be at least a year before the lounge was refurnished, and that it is still uncertain where the money will come from to complete

Dean Spiridon realizes that the

majority of SICC's students have a sense of responsibility. It is only a small percent of immature students who have destroyed the furniture.

The adviser to the Student House Committee, Professor Jerrold I. Hirsch said that last year the chairs were burned up, broken, stepped on, cut up and jumped on. "The only alternative is to educate the student in order that he obtains a sense of responsibility. After all it is his home away from home," Professor Hirsch stated.

Professor Hirsch commented, "The lounge is a place for opening a book or carrying on a conversation. It is not a rumpus room, however, that's how it was treated. There is talk now of establishing a Student Center Fee of one or two dollars to help fund furnishings for the Student Activity areas." Mr. Anthony Orlando, the superintendent of buildings and grounds is trying to secure more ashtrays and trash cans for the lounge.

The round tables which are in the lounge now were originally destined for the discotheque, when the discotheque is opened the tables will be removed.

"Things won't happen overnight," Professor Hirsch said, "and we won't walk around with whkps. The students must learn to respect themselves and respect



To the whole people, the whole party, the whole army, to my nephews and nieces, youth and children, I leave behind by boundless affection.


I also convey my fraternal greetings to the comrades, friends, youth and children in the world.

Student Leaders Resist; And Are Imprisoned

Eugene, Oregon — (CPS) — The student body president of the University of Oregon and a fellow student have been sentenced to two years each in prison for 30 minutes of nonviolent protest against the draft.

Kip Morgan, the president, and David Gwyther, a veteran activist, face incarceration in a Lompoc, Calif. federal prison as a result of their conviction in U.S. District Court last June on three counts of "disrupting Selective Service Proceedings."

Both are currently free on bail to appeal the conviction and sentence.

Morgan acted as judge, Gwyther as prosecuting attorney, and 12 other students as jurors in mock trials conducted at Eugene and Roseburg, Oregon local draft boards last winter.

In each of the two mock trials, the students entered official board meetings en masse, staged a kangeroo court in which board members were pronounced guilty of "crimes against humanity," and left after a short time.

The mock jurors were never indicted, but Morgan and Gwyther, both of whom had been active in movements against military recruiting and police on campus, were brought to trial and charged with using force to disrupt the meetings.

There were no injuries in the incidents and only two witnesses testified there had been physical contact between the students and the board members, but the prosecutor, a U.S. attorney, contended and the jury apparently agreed that the students entry into the meeting was in itself an act of force.

Morgan and Gwyther claimed throughout the trial that they had engaged in no forceful disruption, but rather had made peaceful verbal presentations to dramatize their opposition to military conscription.

The U.S. judge who sentenced them alluded to his experience

under fire as a Red Cross worker in World War II and said, "The war in which my generation fought was no more pleasant than this one in Vietnam. I fail to see a great difference. It was a duty you had to perform."

Gwyther's attorney, citing a recent case in which the same judge sentenced a man found guilty on 13 counts of federal tax evasion to 30 days in jail, questioned the judicial priorities involved since, he said, the tax evader is motivated by selfish ends, the draft law violator by high ideals.

But the judge, directing his comments at Morgan and Gwyther, said, "I don't know about your idealism. There is a question in my mind whether you were sincere or whether you were trying to avoid the draft."

The University of Oregon say Morgan will keep the title of student body president even if he goes to prison; the vice president will be in charge in his absence.

Draft Trouble We Can Help

In this age of violent social upheaval, we read statistically that nearly three out of every four marriages founder, sometimes to the point of irretrievability. Consequently, a vast number of social services, dealing with marriage and personality problems, have come into being. Also, there has been, in recent years, a huge increase those seeking psychiatric help. This is excellent, for now people with manifest problems are realizing their need for help, and are actively seeking

However, in addition to social problems, there are also political ones. Since the Kennedy administration, for example, roughly fifteen millions have been drafted, and most against their wills. The sad point, in addition to the most evident, is that these boys, among them many irrevocably dead, did have some alternative. They did not have to be supressed, much like those seamen abducted by seventeenth and eighteenth century England; rather, they had some legal recourse, before turning to the illegal.

Draft counselling is a social phenomena, now nationally organized, to deal with these draft problems, namely, the draft itself. I personally came into contact with draft counselling last February, when I wished to file with my draft board as a con-

scientious objector, or one who is morally opposed to all war and all organized violence. I sought help from the Catholic Peace Fellowship, which was then located at 5 Beekman St., Manhattan. These people are expressively trained by lawyers in dealing with the draft laws to enable a client to benefit most from a deferment accessible to him.

The CPF, incidentally, is "catholic" only in the "universal" meaning of the word; many of its members are not doctrinnaire Catholics, but humanists who subscribe mainly to the teachings of Jesus Christ and also the pre-Constantinian Catholic Church.

In conclusion, I was so overwhelmed by the ferror and humanistic zeal of the people at CPF, that I decided to join their ranks. I have taken a course in draft counselling, sponsored by the National Lawyers Guild, and we all attend periodic meetings at the American Friends Service Committee (AFSC) to keep abreast of Draft Law changes.

Chicago Trial Opens With Protests

CHICAGO — (CPS)—The trial of the "Conspiracy" on charges resulting from the 1968 Democratic Convention demonstrations has opened in Chicago amid threats of mass protests, accusations that the judge is prejudiced against the eight defendants, and a dispute over press coverage.

On trial for crossing state lines to incite a riot are:

- * Dave Dellinger, 53, Chairmon of MOBE (National Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam), editor of Liberation magazine, a pacifist who was jailed in World War II for refusing induction.
- * Rennie Davis, 28 MOBE project director for the convention, former community organizer.
- * Tom Hayden, 29, SDS founder, author, co-project director for the convention, former Newark, N.J. community organizer.
- * Abbie Hoffman, 32, planner of Yippie "Festival of Life" during convention week, author, former SNCC field worker in Miss., known for absurd performances before Congressional committees.
- * Jerry Rubin, 30, Yippie leader, leader of Free Speech Movement of Berkeley, project director for 1967 Pentagon protest.
- * Bobby Seale, 32, Oakland, Calif., Acting Chairman of Black Panthers.
- * John Froines, 29, MOBE staff, assistant chemistry professor at University of Oregon.
- * Lee Weiner, 29, sociology graduate student, Northwest University.

All are charged under the anti-riot section (title 18) of the 1968 Civil Rights Act, which makes it a felony to travel from one state to another, write a letter, send a telegram, make a phone call or speak on radio or television with intent to encourage any person to participate in a riot—riot meaning an act of violence by one or more persons part of an assemblage of three, which "shall result in injury to the property of another person."

The trial will provide the first constitutional test of the law, which the defense and the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) contend violates the First Amendment's protection of free speech and assembly.

Scheduled during the first week were a candlelight march on the eve of the trial and a mass protest on the steps of the courthouse Sept. 24, the opening day. On Oct. 8-11, SDS and the Black Panthers have called for militant action in Chicago to "bring the war home."

A spokesman for the Committee to Defend the Conspiracy, an organization raising funds for legal defense of the accused, told CPS another demonstration is planned for the day the verdict is delivered. The trial is expected to last two or three months.

In addition Yippie leader Hoffman has threatened to turn Chicago into a vast "People's Park" of protests. "Welcome to the World Series of American injustice," he told the press here. "We are the Conspiracy versus the Washington Kangaroos, who are outside agitators. We got walloped bad by the Chicago Pigs, our crosstown rivals, last year, but we've had a year to learn."

Presiding over the case is U.S. District Court Judge Julius Hoffman, 74, who has a record

of giving harsh sentences to draft resisters. Defense lawyers have claimed publicly that the eight indicted men would have "great difficulty in getting a fair hearing" before Hoffman, because he has already shown hostitity in court, limited the spectators to so small a number that a public trial is impossible, and limited unfairly their challenges of prospective jurors.

Judge Hoffman, called Mr. Magoo by radicals because of his resemblance to the General Electric Co.'s near-sighted mascot, could give the "Chicago 8" up to 10 years in prison, if they are convicted, and a maximum fine of \$20,000 each.

Chief prosecutor is U.S. District Attorney Thomas Foran, a Democrat.

Chief U.S. District Court Judge William Campbell originally issued a directive prohibiting camera and recording equipment in the building, lobby, and surrounding streets and sidewalks of the Federal Building, site of the trial.

But after nine reporters, one cameramen, and a legal researcher were arrested on charges of defying Campbell's order, and after the executive board of the Chicago Newspaper Guild voted to join the ACLU in challenging the order's constitutionality, the judge modified it to allow for interviews and photo sessions in a room inside the building and on floors without courtrooms.

The ban on activity just outside the building where the newsmen were arrested remains in effect though.

Meanwhile, the fourth policeman to be indicted on charges of using undue violence during the convention was acquitted this week. Police Sgt. Arthur Bischoff, 38, was found innocent of violating the civil rights of a photographer.

Three other Chicago policemen have been acquitted of the same charge, and three have yet to stand trial.

SG New Amendment Get Smart and Run

By Election Committee At the Senate Meeting of Thursday, September 25, Article IV, Section V of the constitution of SICC reads "A candidate for the office of President shall, at the time of his election and installation, have a cumulative scholastic average of at least 2.3. A candidate for the offices Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Chief Justice shall also have an average of 2.3. A candidate must be at least of Upper Freshman standing. To be elected, each must receive a plurality of the votes cast by the Student Body in a general election.

The new amendment, "A candidate for the office of President shall, at the time of his election and installation, have a cumulative scholastic average of at least 2.0. A candidate for the offices Vice President. Secretary. Treasurer, and Chief Justice shall also have an average of 2.0. A candidate must be at least of Upper Freshman standing. To be elected, each must receive a plurality of the votes cast by the Student Body in a general election, was passed by the Senate with a 10-for, 6-against, and 1 abstention vote.

NOTE: A student who has under a 2.0 index can be granted special permission by the SAAB and students may be eligible to serve on a committee if he has under a 2.0 index. All amendments to the Constiution must be voted upon by the Student body.

To vote you must register in C128 between now and Oct. 8. Voting for the amenment will take place on Oct. 9-10.

Because of this proposed amendment, students who have the required index of 2.3 for office positions and 2.0 for a senate position, will have until October 10 to get their petitions into the Election Committee of S.G. in room C130. All students who are running should give their platform to the Dolphin. If the amendment to the Constitution is passed, students who have under a 2.0 index will have October 13, 14, 15 to give their petitions to Professor Genco, and whether they can run or not will be decided by the SAAB on October 14. In the event that the proposed amendment is approved, students running for office positions with a 2.0 index should submit petitions to the Election Committee on October 13, 14, and 15.

Whether or not the amendment is passed or defeated, the Elections will take place Friday, October 24, Monday, October 27, and Tuesday, October 28.
