



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#### MY LOBSTER DIMMER WITH LOBSTER BOY


Chris Sorrentino: Can you tell us a little something about your self? Maybe where you came from?

Chris: Uh...Okay. Maybe nobody likes you cause you smell like week old clam chowder. And I'm talking white chowder, not red my friend.


Lobster Boy: Yeah, that smell your talking about is coming from my vagina.

Lately, with comics like Lara Croft, Witchblade, and Sailor Moon (which features lesbian superheros), publishers have been flirting with feminism.

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




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
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## CSI Women's Volleyball Set Straight




I don't understand why people accuse women's volleyball of being nothing but an objectified display of female flesh. Here at CSI, we take this sport quite seriously.
