

Most of you will now go elsewhere to continue your "higher" education. Some of you are about to get married or go to work or enter the armed forces in the service of your country. All of you will help select the 38th President of the United States.

Wherever you now go, all of you will be a part of the nation's effort to redefine the meaning of itself.

Many of you have done things which reflect great credit on this College. Some of you have done things here which dishonor the main purposes and values of this College. Your successes are yours. Your failures are ours — yours, your teachers', and mine. Your successes touch other people personally. So do your failures.

Perhaps something has happened to you here which will have some educational bearing upon what you will do next. I hope so, but we'll never know until you do whatever you are going to do next — until you find yourself in the position you put me in when you ask me to write this message. With your own children, with your friends and professional colleagues, through the life's work you undertake, you will someday find yourself responsible for the education of others. That will be the moment of truth about the meaning of your own education. At such a moment, believe me, it is almost impossible to "cop-out." At such a moment you will be compelled to come to grips with what you don't know as well as what you know.

The ultimate self-indulgence is to preach freedom to others. They will never understand what you mean except in the terms of what you, yourself, do or don't do. The greatest American virtue is not simply to act, but to think and to act — to act thoughtfully.

In some ways this yearbook will illustrate the principles I have stated above. Some people may see in this yearbook the proof of our failures — yours and ours. But if this yearbook is at all true to the way this Class is, it will afford ample evidence of why we should trust one another to keep the faith. We have tried to take this Class seriously. For doing that this College, your alma mater, deserves all the criticism it may get. And perhaps, on some bright, distant day, when you laugh with your children over the pages of this book, you will understand even better what it means to grow older and move on.


The moment passed, noticed and unnoticed.

Asleep on the sea.








