The work and the never-ending need for more time (if only there were more than twenty-four hours in one day) finally reach their goal: commencement.

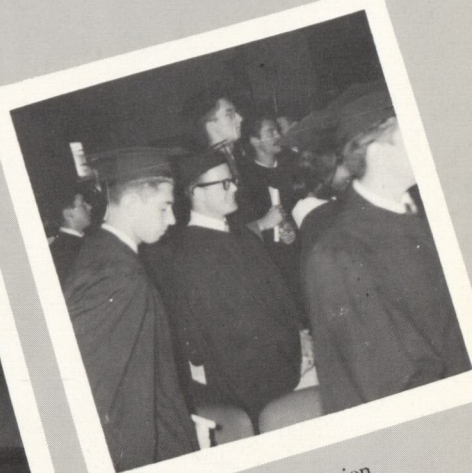
